STRONGER HSC STANDARDS

MINIMUM LITERACY AND NUMERACY STANDARD

Set for success in day-to-day life, the minimum standard is set at a level of literacy and numeracy needed to do things like: follow simple written workplace procedures, interpret routine tables, graphs and charts, write a job description.

ONLINE LITERACY AND NUMERACY TESTS

Students will need to pass online reading, writing and numeracy tests to demonstrate achievement of the minimum standard. From 2018, these tests will be available for students to sit at least twice a year in: Year 10, Year 11, Year 12 and for up to 5 years after starting the HSC. - Consultation on exemption policy

- First Year 10 students sit online reading, writing and numeracy tests

2020

- First HSC students required to meet minimum standard
