Working With Children Check

Final phase-in group begins

The final sectors in child-related work in NSW are now being phased in to the Working With Children Check. Volunteers and existing paid workers in child-related work in the remaining health and education sectors are now encouraged to apply for a Working With Children Check and must be compliant by 31 March 2018.



These groups are

- Children's health services – all remaining Local Health Districts
- The Sydney Children's Hospitals Network (Randwick and Westmead)
- Justice Health and Forensic Mental Health Network
- Ambulance Service of NSW
- Early education and child care
- Children's Health – remaining services
- Education – all remaining services
- Education and care service – approved provider, manager, or certified supervisor
