Guest Speaker: The Hon. Sarah Mitchell, Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning

Minister Mitchell delivered a presentation around the following key topics:

- 2020 impacts of bushfire, drought, pandemic on schools
- Challenges for schools, P&Cs, parents, the community of more than 1.7 million people
- Schools doing a great job at adapting to challenges, particularly with school attendance, learning from home and then returning to school
- Acknowledgement of variation of technology access across NSW schools
- To date there have been approximately 50 schools affected by COV-ID
- Communication from DoE to parents/ carers is easier with increase in community engagement
- Digital Hub to support students and the curriculum
- Devices such as laptops were provided to year 11 and year 12 students, where needed
- Acknowledged impact of not being able to have parents on-site at schools, including impact on P&C fundraising

Questions & Answers

Q: Where do you see P&C associations in the future, particularly during the current pandemic and what support would be provided to those P&C Associations that have been financially impacted by the pandemic?



A: The plan is to keep communication open between P&C Federation and the Department of Education to allow ongoing discussions. And also note the Government funding via Gonski funding packages to schools.

Q: What is being done with access to technology in rural and remote areas?

A: There is more push to ensure access to technology, internet access, resources and support for students. The Department is looking at converting the challenges of the pandemic and turning them into opportunities. As a result, the Department can now have a targeted approach to learning.

Q: What is being done to get more mental health and wellbeing services into schools?

A: Looking at providing resources to parents and having resources available to students. There is a commitment in ensuring every high school has either a full-time counsellor or psychologist and additional Student Support Officer positions to support these roles. There are ongoing discussions regarding other resources which can be provided to schools.

Currently have fly-in and fly-out psychology services in rural and remote areas in partnership with Royal Flying Doctor Service and looking at partnering and collaborating with other organisations to share resources throughout the state.
