

COVID-19 changes

Changes now in effect

- Masks no longer mandatory (except in Schools for Specific Purposes, support units)
- **RAT testing changed to symptomatic testing** at discretion where a student or staff member is unwell and/or displays COVID-19 symptoms
- Visitors are welcomed back to school, regardless of vaccination status
- Families, students and staff are encouraged to continue following COVID-smart measures

Why is this work important?



Support early in school life




Most likely to develop positive behaviours and have improved **post-school outcomes**
