THE GREAT NUNDLE DOG RACE







Natasha Harvey and Donna Denton are proud office-bearers of the Nundle Public School P&C Association. They are both passionate advocates for the power of local communities and getting back to basics - giving back in an event that brings the entire community back for a shared experience that is Nundle's "thing".

Nundle Public School educates 24 students, in a town of approximately 500 people. This small community has been home of the Great Nundle Dog Race for 44 years; a tradition the P&C has been instrumental in growing and expanding year-on-year. Building on a unique event rather than reinventing fundraising activities from scratch has enabled Nundle to build a tradition that is not just fun for the community but that is attractive to sponsors and to visitors from around the country.

In such a small community Natasha and Donna emphasise the importance of splitting up the big event into smaller discrete roles where possible, to spread the load according to each individual's skills and interests.
